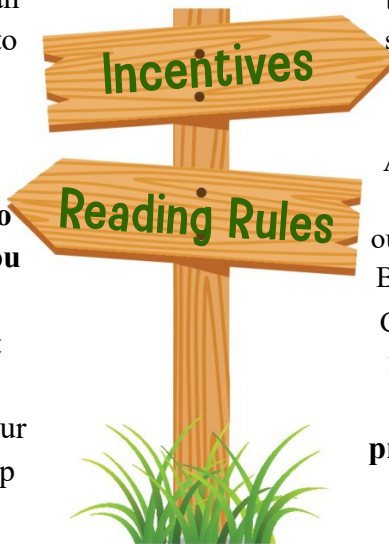
Registration

Registration for the Parlin-Ingersoll Public Library Summer Reading Program starts **Monday, May 23rd**. Registration will be accepted in-person, by phone (309-647-0328), e-mail (SummerReading@parliningersoll.org) or a private message through our Facebook page.

1. Register through the library.
2. Children in grades K-12th can earn 1 stamp for every 30 minutes of reading they do. Non-school aged children can earn 1 stamp for every 5 books read to them.
3. Read books at your reading level.
4. Keep track of your minutes or books read each week. **This is important so you can earn as many stamps as you can!**
5. Our volunteers will have your logs at the Summer Reading table, but you can fill them out. Once you return your filled log, you will receive your stamp total to spend or save for the week.



Incentives will be a little different this year.

Readers will receive stamps depending on how much they read. They can either save their stamps for a bigger prize or spend their stamps right away for a smaller prize at our Trading Post. Every child who turns in any time read will be able to choose one food coupon once every week.

After they have read 12 hours (K-12) or 120 books (ages 2-Pre-K), they will be entered to win one of our grand prizes and earn the ticket to the pool party. But they can still keep reading to earn more stamps! Children will also get a chance to win bigger prizes for participating in some of our planned activities.

Fridays (6/10, 6/17, 6/24, 7/1, 7/8, 7/15*): 7th-8th grade @ 9:30 am, 9th-12th grade @ 11:00 am (Each session is roughly 1 hour in length) *7/15: 7th-12th Grades will be all together at 9:30 am.

Thursday, June 9th, 11:00am: Wild Times Exotics will be bringing 7 different animal ambassadors including a snake, tarantula, and other wild creatures. This program will take place inside the Donaldson Center at Wallace Park. **No food or drinks are allowed at this performance.**

Thursday, June 16th, 10:00am: Lakota Hoop Dancer Starr Chief Eagle's presentation will include fun and educational explanations of Lakota culture. Starr values audience participation and encourage a hands-on learning experience through language, dance, and storytelling. She concludes her time with the rare Native American Hoop dance that resembles a lifetime of dedication to this artform. This performance will take place at Wallace Park.

Thursday, July 7th, 2:00pm: Campfire at Camp Poison Oak- Join us around the campfire for lots of stories, singing and silliness. There will be magic and mystery; games and guffaws. Find out what creatures might live in Lake Poison Oak and help solve the mystery that's been told by camp counselors for decades. No fear, nothing itchy or scratchy will be provided at the program. Great for kids K-5th grade! This program will take place inside the Donaldson Center at Wallace Park.

All Day, Every Day Fun

Golden Book Hunt- Three books will be hidden throughout the children's sections of the library. Come in every day to hunt for them and earn an extra prize!

Scavenger Hunts- This summer we will have 3 different hunts, but children are only allowed to complete 1 per week.

-The Animal Scavenger Hunt: have fun finding all 30 pictures of wild animals throughout the library.

-The Tracks Scavenger Hunt: locate all 15 pictures of footprints belonging to native Illinois animals.

-The Camping Scavenger Hunt: packing for camp requires a lot of supplies! Find all 20 items that you need for a great trip!

Genre Badge Challenge- (For 9th grade and up) Read 12 books (one for each category listed on the log) and earn a button for each category. More detailed instructions can be found on the challenge log.

Final Swim Party at Big Creek Park 7/19 7:00-8:30 pm- For readers who completed their Summer Reading goal. Parents are encouraged to attend. Parents and Children swim for free. (Rain date 7/21)
